




NKOZI HOSPITAL CASUALTY WARD.

FUFU, MANGSHIMU

Boxer Edward Kakembo has blamed Ghana's famed traditional dish 'Fufu' for his loss to homeboy Isaac Dogboe in the WBO African featherweight title fight in Accra on Saturday.

The Ugandan boxer was stopped in the 6th of scheduled 10-round fight at the Accra Sports Stadium because of stomach problems. Dogboe (14-0, 8 KOs) dominated the fight from the gong. Kakembo (11-1, 3 KOs) was forced into a public court in the third round.

"He got the advantage because I fell sick. I was weak because I developed a running stomach and vomited. The problem could have been that bad food called Fufu,"

"The food (a mixture of mashed yams, or cassava and maize) was bad. It tasted like some malwa. As soon as I tasted it I had problems. I was actually considering pulling out but as a fighter, I had to fight," explained the boxer on return from Accra yesterday.

The result was a major setback for Kakembo who gained prominence after beating Waidi 'Skoro' Usman of Nigeria to win the to the African Boxing Union (ABU) featherweight title in Lagos in December. With his spectacular ABU victory fresh in the air in West Africa, Kakembo was accorded a grand welcome. He also got an opportunity to meet former Ghana president Jerry Rawlings.

John Kateregga, a first year student of Journalism at Ndejje University is the winner of the Nkozi Hospital run, which was held on Saturday, to raise funds for the construction of the hospital's accident emergency unit.

The 10km race was flagged off at the Equator at Kayabwe, on Masaka Road by Emmanuel Cardinal Wamala. The runners, who numbered over 2000, raced through two routes, Kayabwe and Nabusanke, before converging at the sports ground of Nkozi Primary School.

Rose Byarugaba, a farmer based in Kyabadaaza, in Mpitigi district, was the best female runner. Mariam Gamwera, a student of St. Mary's SS, Nkozi was also recognised as one of the best runners.

The marathon was boosted by the participation of Cardinal Wamala (the chief runner), Prince David Wassajja, and popular singer Bobi Wine. Other luminary participants included the Vice-Chancellor of Uganda Martyrs' University Nkozi, Prof. John Chrysostom Maviiri.

The Executive Director of Bank of Uganda, Mary Katarikawe, who represented the Governor, Prof. Emmanuel Tumusime Mutebire, commended the Catholic Church for its significant contribution to the health sector. She later announced the Governor's donation of sh20m to the hospital. Other donors included Ruparella Foundation (sh5m) and Cardinal Wamala (sh1m).

Philip Amery contributed 11 points for the Warriors, who also had Eric Malinga continue his long road back from knee trouble with six points. The Warriors led 29-22 at half-time and out-scored UPDF by six in the third frame to take total control of the affair. The Tomahawks came into the game on the back of a surprise victory over the Ndejje Angels but only managed two points in the first five minutes in a contest that needed a special effort for Mande Baker's team to have a chance of victory. Ferdinand Odiama grabbed 15 points and 11 rebounds while Moses Muhumuza contributed 14 points for UPDF, who have won two of seven games.
