

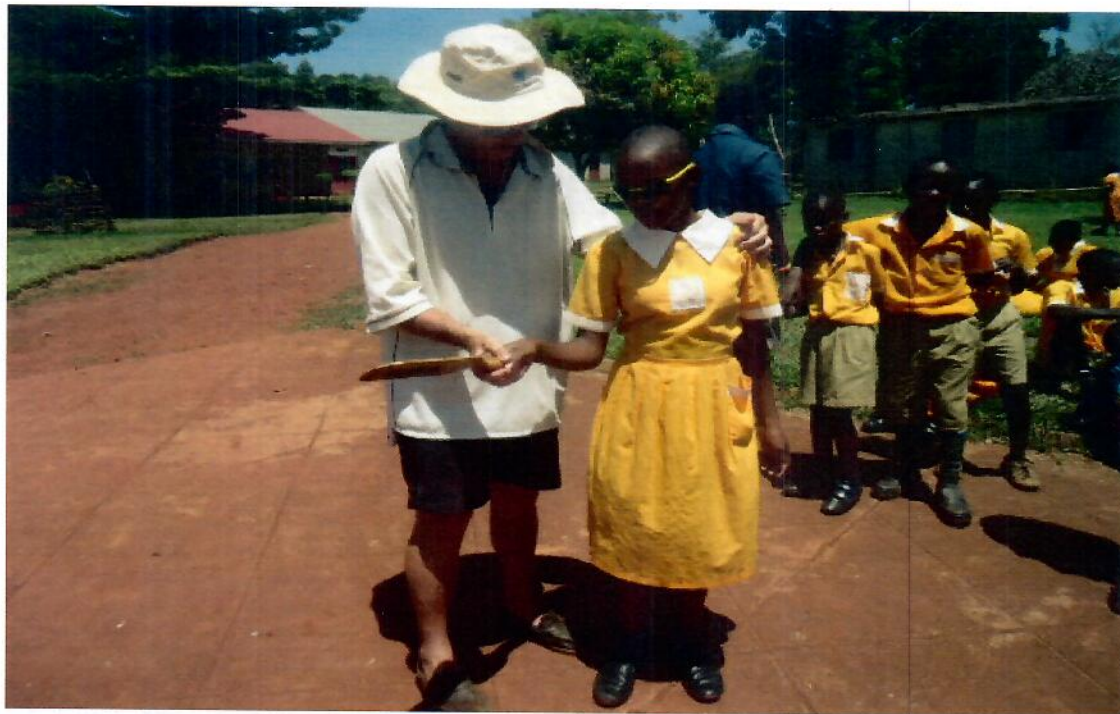
1/ we want to do the event 28-29 July as this is UN Day for disabled and again good publicity

- *To improve access to cricket for visually impaired and improve support for annual tournaments*
  - *To train teachers and cricket officials so they are ready to help in support of visually impaired cricket*
  - *To ensure all schools have equipment and skills to make cricket part of their school curriculum*
  - *To see long term, adults playing visually impaired cricket and a group of trained coaches with support of Uganda cricket association to see expansion of game across Uganda*

## **Background**

*In May 2006, visually impaired cricket was first introduced in Uganda. Coaches and athletes took part in training session and matches. This was then supported by Uganda Cricket Association and Uganda Paralympics Committee in 2010 and 2014, respectively, and in line with making it inclusive to all. We are committed to seeing visually impaired cricket extended into society and to build on these early programmes. As one participant said at the time, "this was the first time I have ever played sport and I'd love to take part on a regular basis and make VI cricket part of world of cricket and look to one day taking part in VI world cricket cup."*

## **Project Justification**

*"Blindness is always used to make me feel useless but cricket has been a friend that has helped."*

*"The game's given me so much beyond just the sport - it's given me independence," he said. "I was so scared of doing everyday things like going on the train by myself but now I travel on my own."*

*These comments come from M.Hassan VI England cricket captain speaking at the 2014 World Cup.*

*The aim now is to develop visually impaired cricket over a five year time period, with the objective that all the schools, boys and girls, will have sufficient equipment to be playing cricket. At the moment, there are seven schools playing visually impaired cricket. In addition, there are some fourteen coaches who have some knowledge of visually impaired cricket, and we hope to improve them so with each school will be playing games on a regular basis.*

---

*We aim to have an annual visually impaired cricket competition. There would be a week set aside each year in which the visually impaired cricketers would take part in this competition. It would be a great opportunity to extend the profile of the game and encourage sponsorship to help fund the tournament.*

*We also want to develop a plan for an adult league after we have set in place cricket structures within schools, alongside working with the UCA, to develop more coaches and funding from associations, in line with the guidelines from the ICC, of taking cricket to marginalized communities.*

### **Partners**

*We shall be working with Uganda Cricket Association (UCA) and looking to get international support and funding. This will include the Blind Cricket England and Wales (BCEW) and Change Foundation of the UK, a charity that has visited Uganda. It is hoped they can offer technical support and possibly fact finding missions to get funding and sponsorship.*

*Furthermore, to work with Uganda Blind Sports Association to build up new skills in children plus a National Council of Sports to oversee visually impaired cricket and the goals set. David Turner, will be a valuable asset in talking to organizations like the UCA. He has considerable experience from the UK and West Africa where he has worked with grassroots cricket.*

*We are looking to work with local sponsors and secure NGO funding, to increase opportunities for all children in line with the UN's policy of every child's Right to Play and see that Uganda works to make sure over the next few years we see Rights for the visually impaired are met.*

*We will look at working with partners to develop sufficient coaches, umpires and equipment to ensure the game is developed over next few years. We plan to train teachers at their schools in order to have enough teachers trained as coaches. The target districts and schools will include:*

*Mukono District – Salama School for the Blind (Primary) and Sir Apollo Kagwa SS*

### **Help from supporters**

**As a new project we are looking for support from various donors/supporters and I am explaining the advantages to any organizations are many on different areas .**



Firstly myself I am ex trainer of blind cricket in UK and west Africa with one of biggest sports charities in UK called change foundation (it was formally called cricket for change up to its name change in 2012) they have projects in UK Jamaica with international cricketer Chris Gayle working with disadvantaged youth in London and Kingston Jamaica plus working in south Africa. They have many sponsors from UK government to banks /trust funds and will be a great opportunity for any supporter to access a partnership with them to expand their work in UK and Africa.

Also I have talked to their deputy director Andy dably Walsh ( who is partial blind and vice captain of English cricket team ) to make a official link with a foundation/supporters in Uganda . also I enclose information attached they have annual award for disabled sports person called "Hit the top " is rewarded each July in uk and covers global sport and is something that I am keen to work on here , so I see both raising profile here through sponsorship and internationally all cricket with visually impaired I will be put on their webpage and they will link it up to English cricket board disabled section to again raise profile of cricket here .

We want to make this cricket cup a start to help growth of VI cricket taking off and I have met with various media channels here TV/newspaper and are all excited about event and coming to day and follow up cricket after this day . I have written to BBC here and both their international radio/TV plus their kiswashelli sports section are keen to film children playing firstly in their schools and later the event .

Again great advertising for any company/person . I think also we will see joy/happiness from children themselves in playing and learning a new sport that many of them are having no access before . we are wanting that VI CRICKET will be one day up to international standards and bring teams here from UK/Australia over next years and again another sports charity called cricket without borders who have visited this country are wanting to show support sending over equipment and advertising again the cricket here with blind .
